THE CONTEXT

Since the enactment of National Education Law No. 20/2003 and some other regulations such as standardization of educational process, standard of counselor qualification and competences, roles and functions of guidance and counseling services as a subsystem of the national education system in Indonesia more steady and solid. The existence of guidance and counseling as a part of the national education system is also supported by the publication of "Rambu-rambu Penyelenggaraan Layanan Bimbingan dan Konseling dalam Jalur Pendidikan Formal" in 2007 in collaboration with Directorate General of Higher Education, Ministry of Education and Culture, RI.

Therefore, all official rules are a manifestation of actual recognition of the wider community and stakeholders on the importance of guidance and counseling in support of the achievement of the national education goals. However, in terms of concept development and implementation patterns, guidance and counseling services in various educational institutions are often hampered by confusion about how the conceptual and practical guidance and counseling services should be organized.

Moreover, the Government of Indonesia has managed a huge project of teacher certification and teacher continuing professional development since 2006's. They are a program which is to acknowledge a professional status of teachers. The accomplishment of a professional teacher counselor certificate should not be regarded as the ultimate goal, but it just the beginning of professional improvement as teacher counselor. Through ongoing professional development, teacher counselors are expected to have more skills to managing and developing guidance and counseling services more better than ever.

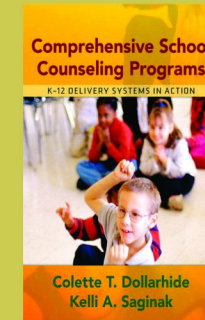

5. Full papers of selected abstracts should be submitted to the seminar committee before August 15, 2012 by email to email address above. It consists of abstract, introduction, methodology, result and discussion, conclusion, and bibliography. It is not more than 10 pages, times new roman 12, and 1.5 spacing in A4 paper with standard margin. The papers will be published in proceeding with ISBN.
